# Vail, Colorado by Jana Voelke Studelska

Where: Deep in the Rocky Mountains, about 100 miles west of Denver on Interstate 70.

Focus: Say "Vail" and everyone knows you're talking about skiing. The reputation is well-deserved. Vail Resort is the biggest ski resort in the United States, with 5,289 acres, 193 ski trails, and 34 chairlifts, including a year-round gondola. Vail also has world-class dining, boutique shopping and top-notch cultural events, making this small town (population 4,500) the object of many dream vacations. Summer is equally as inviting with music, dance and film festivals and outdoor sports of almost every kind imaginable.


Atmosphere: Many Western ski communities began as former mining towns. But Vail, resembling a European alpine village, was built in the early 1960s to serve the burgeoning ski resort. Vail doesn't have Aspen's nightlife, but there's no shortage of cosmopolitan partying. This

year, Vail is in the middle of a billion dollar renewal project in the pedestrian mall areas known as Vail Village and Lionshead.

How to get there: By car, two hours west by interstate from Denver. Most out-of-staters, however, fly directly into Eagle County Airport. During ski season, non-stop service from 17 U.S. cities is available. Private jet owners fly into Vail Valley Jet Center, where they're greeted by a concierge and white glove treatment.

Famous residents: President Gerald Ford, an avid skier, still owns a home here. Several Hollywood celebrities have homes here, but locals keep lips tight.

For more information: Check out www.visitvailvalley.com, the Vail Valley Chamber and Tourism Bureau's Web site, where you can explore Vail through an interactive map, and even make vacation reservations. Lastminute vacationers can often find good deals on the site.



### **Vacation Hotspot**

Summer in Vail offers the usual activities such as hiking and horseback riding. There's also whitewater rafting, summer music with the visiting New York Symphony Orchestra at the Gerald R. Ford Amphitheater, guided ATV adventures or a day at a mountain bike class.

In winter, hit the slopes and enjoy some of Vail's world-famous "champagne" powder. Not a skier? Ride the gondola to Adventure Ridge on top of Vail Mountain to snow tube, ice skate, bike ski or snowshoe.

## Lake Gaston, North Carolina

Where: Lake Gaston straddles the North Carolina-Virginia border, about 70 miles north of the Raleigh/Durham area and 80 miles inland from the Atlantic coast.

How to get there: Two interstates, I-95 and I-85, bracket the lake, providing easy access to either end. By car, it's an easy trip from Washington, D.C. (170 miles) or the Raleigh-Durham area (90 miles). The Halifax County Airport has a 4,000-foot landing strip, accommodating small private planes.

How big: Lake Gaston was created in 1963, with the completion of the Gaston Dam. Today the lake is 34 miles long, with 350 miles of shoreline and 20,000 acres of water. A number of "creeks" lead into the lake, creating large coves and bays. At its widest, it's more than a mile from shore to shore.

Atmosphere: Cabin owners are very proud of the lake quality, which has been rated as some of the cleanest water in the eastern United States. An active property owners' association and cooperative task forces are busy making sure it stays that way. The lake's dam (used for electrical generation) and shoreline (up to the high water mark) are controlled by Dominion Power, and the lake level is very stable. Set-back restrictions and lakeshore regulations have ensured a forested shoreline. Lands surrounding the lake are entirely privately owned, so commercialization on the lake is minimal. There are no state parks or public areas, no industry, no big resort complexes. A few marinas keep

boats gassed up and offer a place to catch up on the latest lake news. Mom-and-pop markets still dot the area, and surrounding towns offer shopping and medical facilities. There are public accesses, but very few day-trippers.

Focus: Life on Lake Gaston is all about the water. The stability and beauty of the lake make water sports the focus of all activity. So much so that a volunteer Coast Guard Auxiliary patrols the lake! One lake resident, a former world champion wake boarder, offers lessons on his slalom course, also used by the lake's water-skiers. Look for sailboats, personal watercraft and a few houseboats, as well. Fishing is big on Gaston. There are tournaments all year-round as anglers look for bass and crappie.

Who comes here: Lake Gaston's residents are an interesting mix of tech and medical workers with young families from Raleigh-Durham, former government employees and retired military from Washington, D.C., and weekenders from the Virginia Beach area. Increasingly, lake property owners are becoming permanent residents – perhaps as many as 60 percent stay year-round now. Many properties are rented out by the week to vacationers, who make reservations a year or two ahead.

Property values: Vacant lots are becoming scarce, driving the prices up dramatically. Today, lots on the main body of the lake start at \$400,000, and lots on navigable creeks start at \$150,000. Existing properties have doubled in value over the last decade. Prices on the main lake are higher — buyers love the view. A second ring of "offshore" properties are being bought up, starting at \$150,000.

**Taxes:** Because Lake Gaston's shoreline falls in two states and five counties, property taxes depend on where you are. Generally, property owners find the taxes and insurance to be significantly lower than that found in the northeastern seaboard states.



## Millinocket, Maine by Jana Voelke Studelska



Where: Smack-dab in the geographical center of Maine, with Canada about 100 miles to the north, east and west. Beyond Millinocket? Forest, lakes and mountains. And moose. Lots of moose.

How to get there: Before the mid-1960s, very few ventured to this remote mill town - even mill workers were hard to recruit. Today, Interstate 95 passes not far from Millinocket. The town's airport is almost ready to expand to accommodate private jets. But it's the seaplane base that hums with the most activity: floats in the summer, skis in the winter.

Focus: If you're looking for golf courses and fine dining, just turn around and head south right now. This is the real North Woods, where you don't see the smoke from your neighbor's camp (which is Maine-speak for rustic cabin), and your kitchen water comes from the pond (Maine-speak for lake). In town, things are changing a bit, as Millinocket transforms itself into a four-season destination. There are now 13 white water rafting companies available to take you down the west branch of the Penobscot River, guided wildlife tours, and some cell phone coverage.

Private land: The state of Maine is 89 percent forest, 90 percent of which is privately owned - mostly by large forest industry corporations. That adds up to 17 million acres of woods. There's a long and proud tradition of the privately owned timberlands being open to the public. In fact, an enormous network of privately owned logging roads allows access to most of northern Maine.

Public land: Not far from Millinocket is Baxter State Park, the nation's largest state park at 202,064 acres. It's also the northern terminus for the 2,174-mile-long Appalachian Trail, and home to Mt. Katahdin, climbers' muchloved mile-high mountain. In fact, Mt. Katahdin is featured

on the logo of L.L. Bean, whose corporate home is in Maine.

Fishing and hunting: Hardly a month of the year doesn't go by that some sport fishing or hunting season begins or ends. Moose, bear, duck and goose; deer, salmon, trout, grouse - you name it. With so much forest and water, Maine is home to the largest remaining population of moose east of the Mississippi.

Recreation: Whitewater rafting, canoeing, kayaking, hiking, camping, fishing, hunting, guide services, scenic moose tours, snowmobiling, crosscountry skiing, snowshoeing, mountain climbing. That ought to keep everyone busy for awhile!

Real estate: Almost all recreational properties in the area sit on lots that are leased from the large timber company. It's an arrangement that's mostly unfamiliar to Southerners (Mainespeak for anyone not from here), but quite common in Maine. The lease contracts are renewed every five years, rarely exceeding fees of \$1,500 a year, and can be transferred from generation to generation. If you sell your camp (meaning the buildings on the leased property), the timber company just writes a new contract with the new owner. Compared to real estate on the coastline, leased properties are a deal.

Taxes: You won't get a property tax bill; that goes to the timber company. But you will get a bill from the state assessor for your buildings, and it will be far below the national average for lakeshore property.


